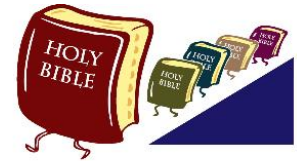
Pastor's Class After Easter.

Come, bring your Bible, invite a friend to join you, and let's explore together "who, what, and where" of our Bibles.



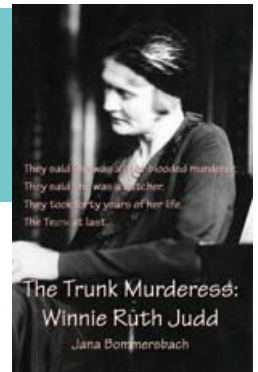
